WHO'S WHO IN THE PRODUCTION STAFF

Randy Conti (DIRECTOR) Randy received his M.A. in Directing and Choreography from Long Island University. Currently, he's the Executive Director of the New York Conservatory for the Arts, an educational and performing multi-arts centre in West Hurley. There he directs the NYCA Repertory Company whose next production is Neil Simon's Odd Couple. (female version). In past Coach House productions, Randy has directed All My Sons, Man of LaMancha, Guys and Dolls and choreographed Anything Goes and Pajama Game. Randy is looking forward to his "highest" feat yet — Peter Pan — performed by the Conservatory at UPAC in June.

Mary Beyea Thayer (ASSISTANT DIRECTOR, STAGE MANAGER) Mary has been a Coach House Players member for two years and is part of the New York Conservatory for the Arts Repertory Company where she has stage managed Crimes of the Heart, A Christmas Carol, and their summer production of Alice in Wonderland. Her stage performances include Gloria in The Wizard of Oz, Annie in the musical Chicago, Erna in the CHP show The Runner Stumbles, and several musical scenes for the CHP's 40th Anniversary Musical Revue last spring. Mary's husband, John, is also a CHP member.

WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

Tom Tierney (SIR ROWLAND) Now in his 12th season with CHP, Tom has directed several shows for us. He's appeared in Oklahoma, My Three Angels, and Social Security. When not on stage he can be found at Key Bank where he serves as Vice-President/Area Manager. On Saturdays and Sundays, he can be found at Georgie's Deli with his wife, Linda (the owner), also a CHP member. Between acting, banking and sandwich making, Tom and Linda are busy on the new chapter of their book What To Do With Two Spare Bedrooms. Both of their daughters are now away at college and are missed very much.

Walter Kortrey (HUGO BIRCH) Walter has played a variety of character parts in recent Hudson Valley community theatre productions. Among them are the Cowardly Lion in *The Wizard of Oz*, Giles Corey in *The Crucible*, and Panisse in the musical play *Fanny*. His only previous appearance with the Coach House Players was in the role of Monsignor Nicholson in the January '90 production of *The Runner Stumbles*. Walter is a member of Holly's Comets, a Woodstock Improvisational Group.

They perform fairy tales in which Molly was the witch in Hansel and Gretel. She was in How to Eat Like a Child at Bailey Junior High. Molly was also in The Wizard of Oz at UPAC. This is Molly's debut for CHP. She hopes to pursue a career in acting.

Joan Storm (MISS PEAKE) Joan has been a resident of Rhinebeck for ten years and is a member of the Rhinebeck Theatrical Society. She was recently in their production of Inherit the Wind. She has also participated in the Mental Health Players Improvisation. Joan's love of performing goes back to her childhood when she was a model. In her spare time, she raises and shows English mastiffs.

Patrick Long (ELGIN) This show marks Patrick's first appearance for Coach House Players. He is a former member of Haffaby Dinner Theatre Productions, UCCC Summer Stock, John A. Coleman High School's Children's Theatre, and Ulster Youth Theatre.
